Safety Precautions

IMPORTANT

- DO NOT remove the labels affixed to the printer. These labels provide operational information and indicate the printer's model number.
- DO NOT push the power button or LED indicator with an object that has a sharp point, such as a pen. This could damage the button or LED.
- DO NOT transport the printer while cables are connected to the AC/DC Connector or USB port. The connector and ports could be damaged.
- DO NOT store the printer in an area exposed to high temperatures, high humidity, direct sunlight, or dust. These could cause discolouration or a malfunction.

General Precautions

Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

- At the time of purchase, the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery is slightly charged so that the operation of the printer can be verified; however, before you use the printer for the first time, you must fully charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery using the AC Adapter.
- If the printer is not in use for long periods, remove the battery and disconnect the cables before storing.
- If you notice anything unusual about the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery the first time it is used, for example overheating or rust, immediately stop using the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery. Contact Brother customer service.

Printer

- If the Bluetooth and wireless LAN functions are both turned on, the communication speed may decrease due to radio wave interference. If this occurs, turn off the function you are not using (the Bluetooth or wireless LAN function).
- DO NOT cover, or insert foreign objects into the Paper Outlet Slot, AC/DC Connector, or USB port.
- DO NOT use paint thinner, benzene, alcohol, or any other organic solvent to clean the printer. Doing so may damage the casing finish. Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the printer.
- When using optional accessories, use them as described in their instruction manuals.
- This printer uses thermal paper. If the printed paper is marked with ink, for example written on or stamped, the ink may cause the printed text to fade or become discoloured. In addition, the applied ink may take some time to dry.

Printed text may fade or become discoloured if the label comes into contact with any of the following: vinyl chloride products, leather goods such as wallets and purses, organic compounds such as alcohol, ketones, or esters, adhesive tape, erasers, rubber mats, magic marker ink, permanent marker ink, correction fluid, carbon, glue, diazo sensitised paper, hand lotion, hair care products, cosmetics, water, or sweat.

- DO NOT touch the printer with wet hands.
- DO NOT use folded, wet, or damp paper, otherwise a paper misfeed or malfunction may occur.
- DO NOT touch paper or labels with wet hands, otherwise a malfunction may occur.
- DO NOT leave the Release Cover open. Internal parts of the printer may collect dust and result in printing failure or paper jams.

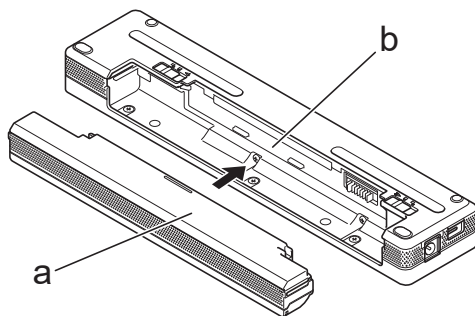
Install the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

1. Slide Battery Latch 1 (a) to the unlocked position.
2. While holding Battery Latch 2 (b) in the unlocked position, remove the Charging Terminal Protection Case (c).



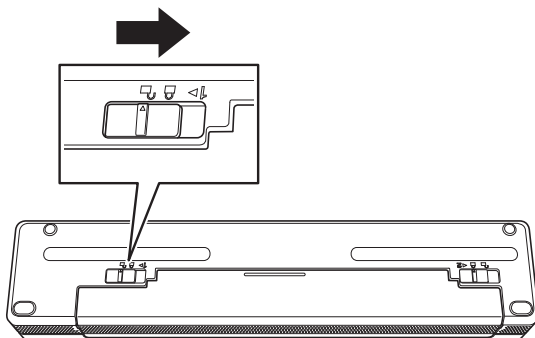
- a. Battery Latch 1

- The voltage supplied by the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery may vary. The printing speed may also vary depending on the voltage.
- When using the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery, the Charging Terminal Protection Case is not required. Keep it in a safe place to avoid losing it.

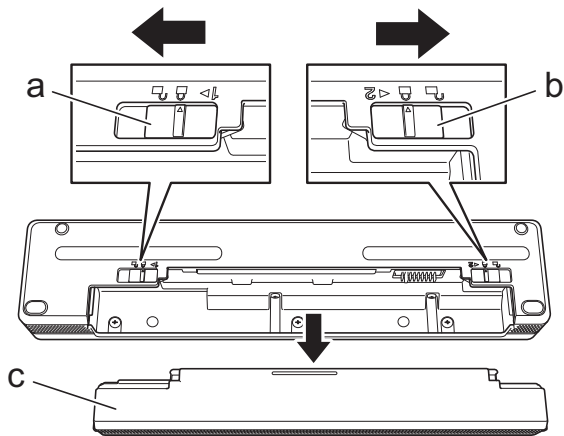

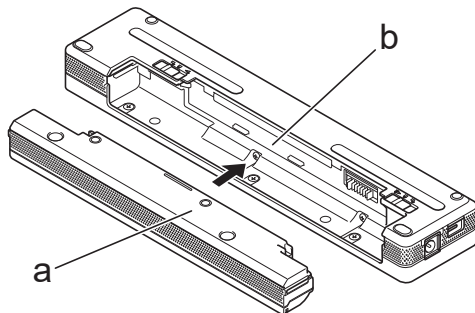
Remove the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

2. While holding Battery Latch 2 (b) in the unlocked position, remove the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery (c).



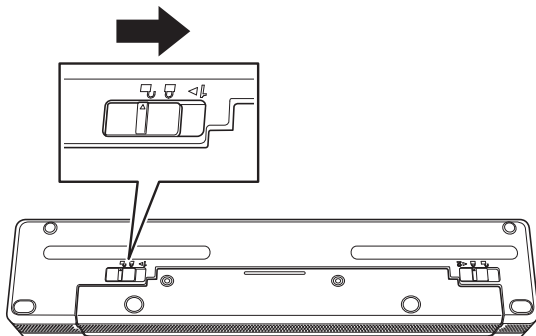
- a. Battery Latch 1

Connect the Printer to External Power



Connecting the printer to a power supply while the printer is off automatically turns the printer on for a system check. If **Auto Power On** is set to **Off**, the printer turns off after the system check.

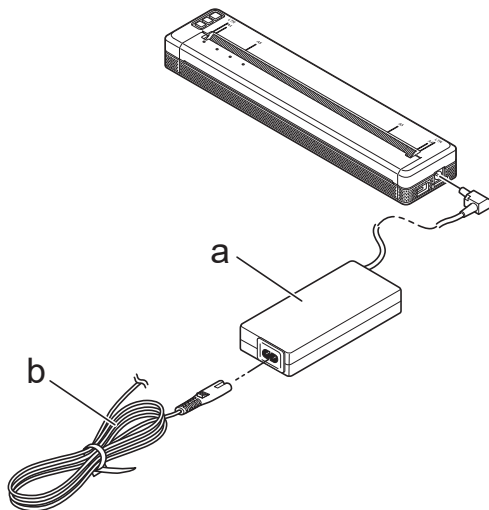
Connect to an AC Power Socket (Optional)

Connect the printer to a nearby AC power socket to power the printer or charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery using AC power. When purchasing the printer, purchase the correct AC Adapter and AC power cord for the region where the printer will be used.



The AC Adapter and AC power cord are optional accessories.

1. Connect the AC Adapter (a) to the printer.
2. Connect the AC power cord (b) to the AC Adapter.
3. Connect the AC power cord to a nearby AC power socket (100 V AC - 240 V AC, 50/60 Hz).

Connect to a DC Power Socket (Optional)

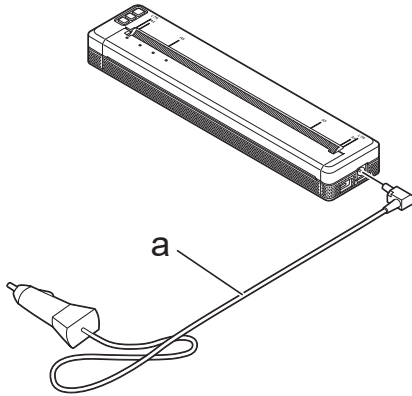
Connect the printer to your vehicle's 12 V DC power socket (cigarette lighter or similar) to charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery.



- The Car Adapter is an optional accessory.
- The voltage supplied by a vehicle may fluctuate, and printing speed may vary.
- The Car Adapter plug is not compatible with other sockets that are not the 12 V cigarette type.

1. Connect the Car Adapter to the vehicle's 12 V DC power socket.

2. Connect the Car Adapter (a) to the printer.



a. Car Adapter

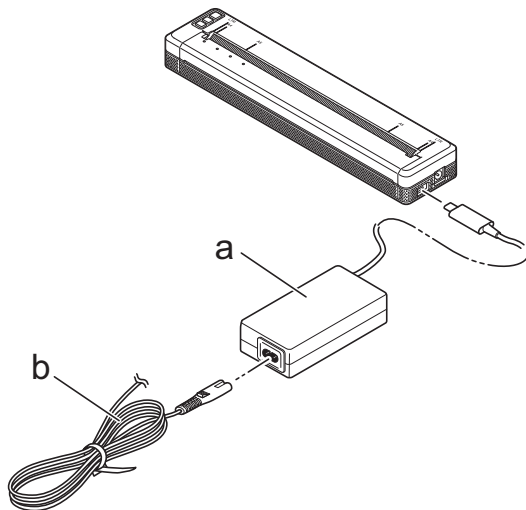
Connect to an AC Power Socket Using the AC Adapter for USB Type-C (Optional)

Connect the printer to a nearby AC power socket to charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery using the AC Adapter for USB Type-C. When purchasing the printer, purchase the correct AC Adapter for USB Type-C and AC power cord for the region where the printer will be used.



- The AC Adapter for USB Type-C and AC power cord are optional accessories.
- The AC Adapter for USB Type-C is for charging only. If the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery is not installed, power cannot be supplied to the printer.

1. Connect the AC Adapter for USB Type-C (a) to the printer.
2. Connect the AC power cord (b) to the AC Adapter for USB Type-C.
3. Connect the AC power cord to a nearby AC power socket (100 V AC - 240 V AC, 50/60 Hz).

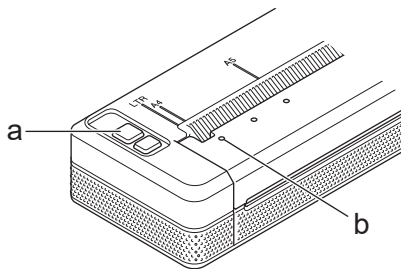

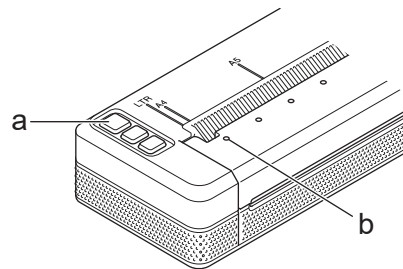
1. Use a fully charged battery, or connect the printer to an AC or DC power socket to power your printer.
2. Press and hold the Power button  (a).

The Power indicator (b) lights in green  (if the printer is connected to an AC or DC power socket) or in orange  (if using the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery).

Tips on Using the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

Fully charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery before using the printer.



- High-density (dark) printing discharges the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery faster than low-density printing. Adjust the print density setting in the printer driver's dialog box, or in the Printer Setting Tool.

- Charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery in an environment with a temperature between 0°C and 40°C, otherwise the battery will not charge.
- The recommended charging temperature range for the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery is between 5°C and 35°C.
- If you use the printer when both the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery is installed and the AC Adapter or Car Adapter is connected, the Status indicator may turn off and charging may stop even if the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery has not been fully charged.
- To prevent deterioration of the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery, charging will not occur when the remaining charge in the battery is sufficient, even if the AC Adapter or AC Adapter for USB Type-C is connected.

Rechargeable Li-ion Battery Characteristics

To ensure the highest performance and longest life from the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery:

- Do not use or store the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery in a location exposed to extreme high or low temperatures as it may deteriorate more quickly.
- Remove the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery when storing the printer for long periods of time.
- Store the Rechargeable Li-ion Batteries with less than a 50% charge in a cool dry place and out of direct sunlight.
- Recharge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery every six months if it is stored for long periods of time.

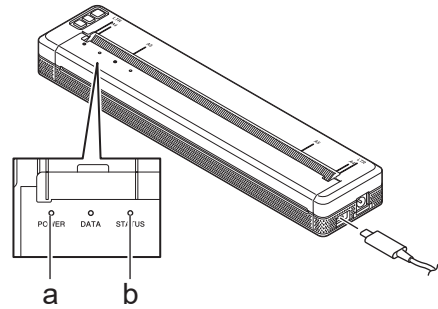
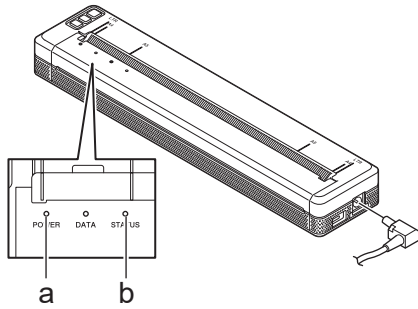
Charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

Charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery as soon as you set up your printer.

1. Turn the printer off.
2. Do one of the following:
 - Use the AC Adapter and AC power cord to connect the printer to an AC power socket.
 - Use the Car Adapter to connect the printer to a DC power socket.
 - Use the AC Adapter for USB Type-C and AC power cord to connect the printer to an AC power socket.
 - Use a USB Type-C cable to connect the printer to your computer or a compatible USB charger.



- Charging with a USB Type-C cable will take longer than other charging methods.
- The USB charger must be 5 V 0.5 A or higher.
- If a USB Type-C cable is not included, use a USB Type-C cable that matches the voltage and electrical current of the USB charger.



- a. Power Indicator
- b. Status Indicator

When the battery is fully charged, the Status indicator turns off.

3. Disconnect the power source from the printer.



When using the dedicated adapter, charge the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery for two hours to fully charge the battery. When fully charged, the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery will print about 600 pages.

Stop Charging the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery

To stop charging the Rechargeable Li-ion Battery, disconnect the printer from the power source.

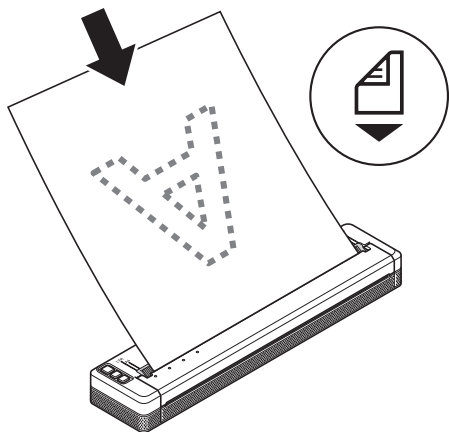

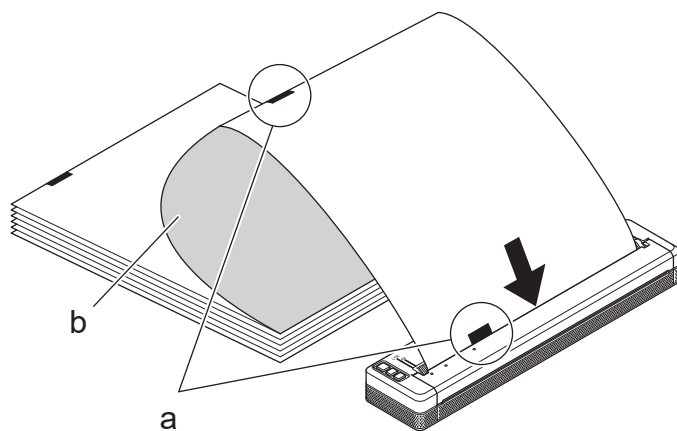
Load Paper in the Printer

1. Use both hands to hold the paper straight.
2. Insert the paper carefully, *print surface face down*, into the printer's input slot until the roller pulls it into the starting position.



For fanfold paper

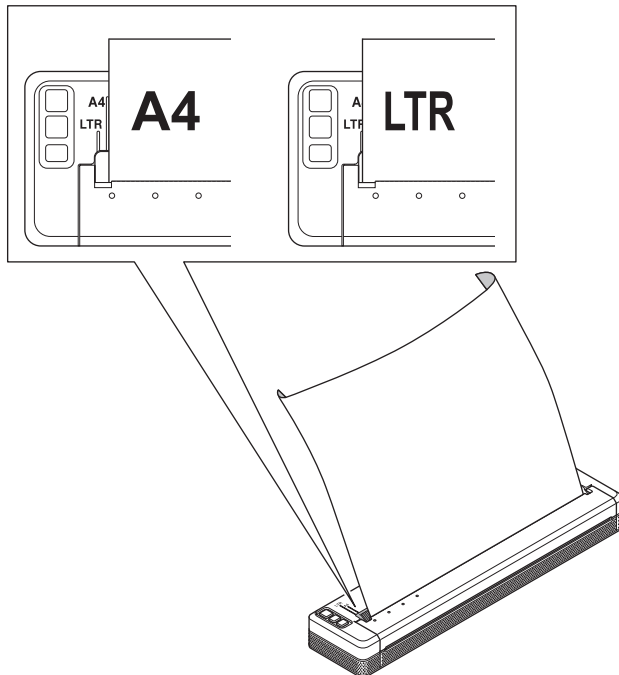
Insert the fanfold paper with the black marks positioned as shown in the illustration.



- a. Black marks
- b. Print surface



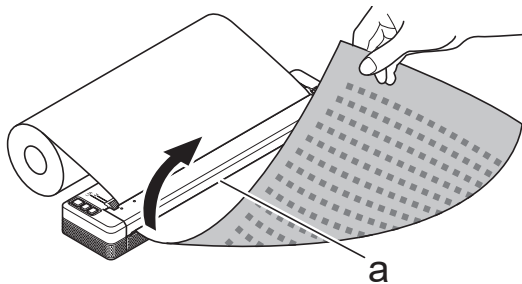
- The bottom edge of the paper must be parallel to the roller.
- Only one side of the paper can be printed. Check the paper, and load it so that the smooth, thermal side faces down.
- When loading A4-size paper, align the paper with the A4 Indicators on the printer. When loading Letter-size paper, align the paper with the LTR Indicators on the printer.



Cut Paper

You can set the paper type to **Cut Sheet**, **Roll**, or **Perforated Roll** in the printer driver.

1. Use the printer's Tear Bar to cut the paper.
2. Pull one edge of the ejected paper up and towards the other edge diagonally.



a. Tear Bar

CAUTION

The Tear Bar is sharp. To avoid injury, do not touch the Tear Bar.

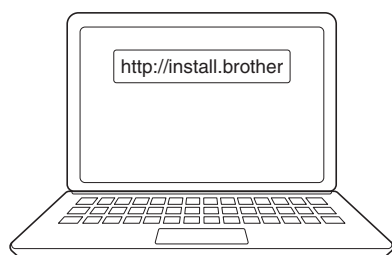

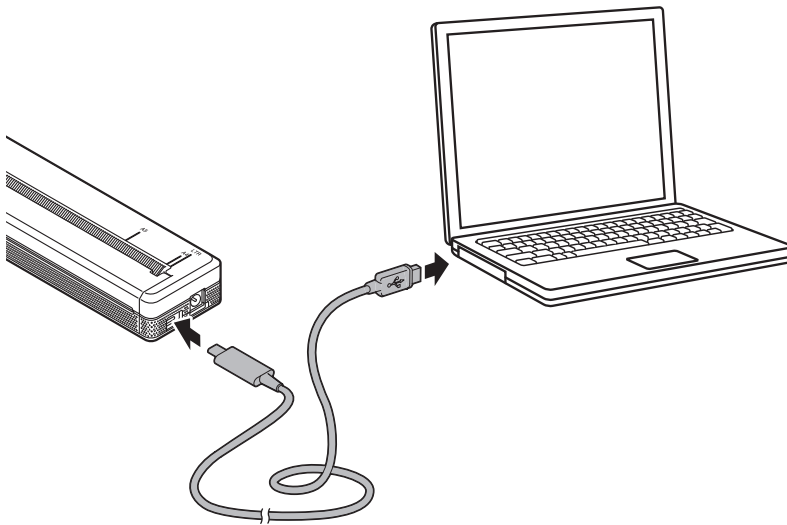

A USB Type-C cable is required for connecting the printer to your computer. It may be included with your printer, depending on your country.

NOTE

The USB connection alone is not sufficient to power your printer. Make sure you install a Rechargeable Li-ion Battery or connect the printer to an external power supply, such as an AC Adapter or Car Adapter.

1. Turn the printer off.
2. Connect the USB cable to the USB Port on the printer, and then to your computer.



3. Turn the printer on.








Configure the printer's Wi-Fi settings to communicate with your Wi-Fi router/access point. After the printer is configured, the computers and mobile devices on your network will have access to the printer.

- Before connecting the printer to your network, contact your system administrator to confirm your Wi-Fi network settings.
- To reconfigure the Wi-Fi settings, or if the status of the printer's Wi-Fi connection is unknown, reset the printer's Wi-Fi settings.
 1. Turn the printer off.
 2. Press and hold the Feed button  and the Power button  for about two seconds.
 3. While holding down the Feed button , press the Power button  two times, and then release the Feed button .

The Power indicator starts flashing in orange .

4. Press the Feed button  twice.
- To achieve the best results with normal everyday printing, use the printer as close to the Wi-Fi router/access point as possible with minimal obstructions. Large objects and walls between the two devices, as well as interference from other electronic devices, can affect the transfer speed of print data.

1. Write down the SSID (Network Name) and Password (Network Key) of your Wi-Fi router/access point.
2. Connect the printer and computer using a USB cable.
3. Press the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button  on your printer to turn the Wi-Fi function on.
 - Make sure the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi indicator  starts flashing in green  or cyan  once every three seconds.
 - If the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi indicator  is flashing in blue , press and hold the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button  for about three seconds. The flashing colour changes each time you press and hold the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button .
4. Configure the Infrastructure Mode settings of the printer.
 - Using a Windows computer:

 - e. In the **Password** field, type **Passphrase**.



The required information depends on the authentication method and encryption mode; enter only the information relevant to your network environment.

- f. Click **Apply**.
- Using a Mac computer:
 - a. Start the Wireless Device Setup Wizard included in the Printer Driver Package, and then follow the on-screen instructions.
 - b. If you have not downloaded the Printer Driver Package, go to your model's **Downloads** page on the Brother support website at support.brother.com to download the package. Double-click the downloaded file. The Wireless Device Setup Wizard can be found in the **Utilities** folder.

When the connection between the printer and your Wi-Fi router/access point is established, the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi indicator (📶) lights in green ● or cyan ●. Computers and mobile devices that are on the same network as the printer will have access to the printer.

Print Using the USB Interface (Mass Storage Mode)



Mass Storage mode allows you to send a file to the printer using the USB interface, without installing the printer driver. This feature supports only BIN, BLF, and JPG files, and can store a maximum of 16 MB.

This feature is useful for:

- Applying printer settings saved in a command file (BIN file format) and adding templates (BLF file format) into your printer without using any software tools. Both types of files must be distributed by an administrator.
- Executing commands without installing the printer driver.
- Using a device with an operating system (including non-Windows operating systems) supporting a USB host feature to print and transmit data.

1. Confirm that the printer is turned off.

2. Press the Feed button  and the Power button  at the same time.

The printer starts up in Mass Storage mode. The Power and Data indicators light in green  (if the battery is used to power the printer, the Power indicator lights in orange ).

3. Connect the computer or mobile device to the printer using a USB cable.

The printer's mass storage area appears as a folder on the computer's or device's screen.



If the mass storage area does not appear automatically, see the instructions for the operating system of your computer or mobile device for information about accessing the mass storage area.

4. Drag and drop the file you want to copy to the mass storage area.

5. Load paper and press the Power button .

The command file is executed. The Data indicator flashes in green .

6. To deactivate the Mass Storage mode, turn the printer off.

The printer restarts in its normal operating mode.

NOTE

- When the printer is turned off, Mass Storage mode is deactivated and any files in the mass storage area are deleted.
- Do not create folders in the mass storage area. If a folder is created, the files in the folder cannot be accessed.
- Depending on file size, commands may fail. If this happens, work with one file at a time.
- Only the USB connection mode is available while the printer is in Mass Storage mode.
- Do not access other files in the mass storage area while copying a file to or from that area.

Notes on Printing Image Data without Using the Printer Driver

Mass Storage mode supports JPEG image printing. The printer converts colour JPEG files to monochrome using the dithering process, which could result in fuzzy images. To improve image quality, avoid or turn off any functions that preprocess images.



PJ-862/PJ-863/PJ-883:

Your printer supports an Object Push Profile (OPP) when printing via Bluetooth.

- Only JPEG images can be printed, that is, this function is limited to files with the .jpg extension.
- The maximum file size is 15.8 MB.
- The maximum resolutions are as follows:
 - PJ-822/PJ-862
Height × Width = 1600 × 2200 dots
 - PJ-823/PJ-863/PJ-883
Height × Width = 2400 × 3300 dots

If these limits are exceeded, the data received by the printer is discarded and not printed.

- Print is at 1 pixel = 1 dot.
- The printer performs binary processing (simple binary) to print the image.
- The image is printed with the height-to-width proportions of the received data.

 - The paper can be loaded after the print job has been sent. If the paper is skewed after the printer pulls it into the starting position, open the Release Cover completely, remove the paper, and then close the cover and load the paper again.

Making Prints Lighter or Darker

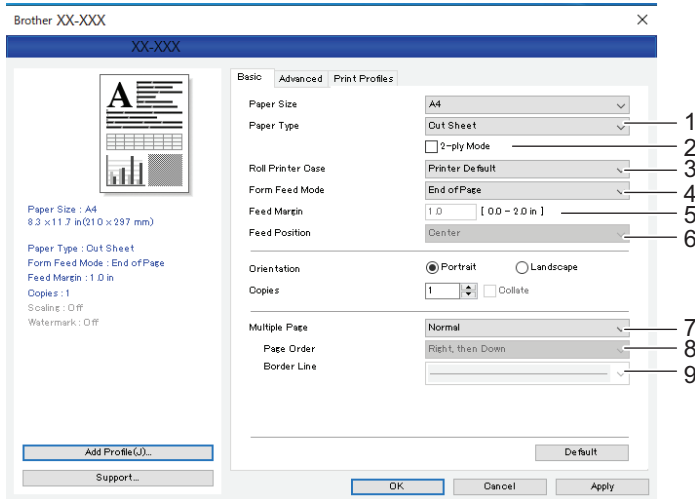

4. Form Feed Mode

Specify how the printer responds to form feed commands received from any source.

No Feed/Feed Margin

If **Feed Margin** is set to **0**, paper is not fed at the end of a job. If a value is entered for **Feed Margin**, paper is fed at the end of the job in the amount of that value. Use this setting when printing on non-perforated roll paper. Make sure to set **Paper Type** to **Roll**.

Fixed Page

Paper is fed at the end of a job to suit the vertical length of the selected page size (for example: letter, legal, A4, or user-defined size). Select this setting when using roll paper. Make sure to set **Paper Type** to **Roll**.

End of Page

Paper is fed until the paper sensor detects a pre-printed end-of-page mark on the paper or the end of the sheet, or until 355.6 mm of paper has been fed. Use this setting when **Paper Type** is set to **Cut Sheet** or **Perforated Roll**.

End of Page Retract

Paper is fed until the paper sensor detects a pre-printed end-of-page mark on the paper. Then, the paper is fed back to the starting position before the next page is printed. Use this setting when **Paper Type** is set to **Perforated Roll**.

5. Feed Margin

Specify the feed margin of the print job. Use this setting when **Form Feed Mode** is set to **No Feed/Feed Margin**.

6. Feed Position

Specify the paper feed position for printing on custom paper.

7. Multiple Page

Select to print more than one page on a single sheet of paper.

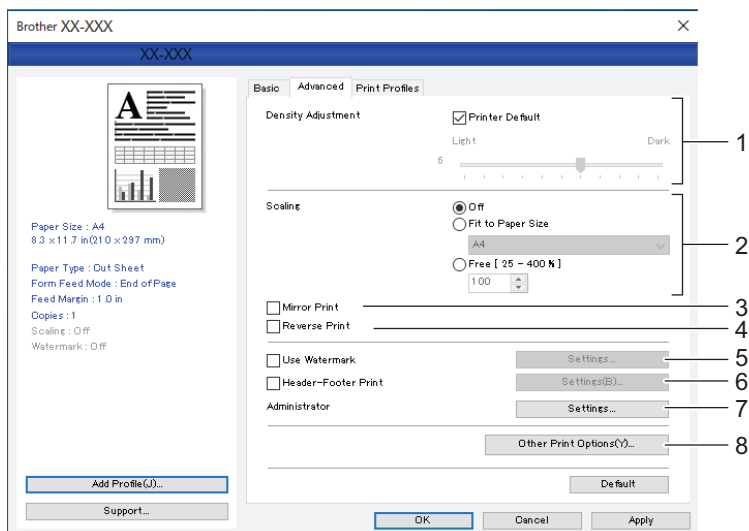
8. Page Order

Specify the page order when a setting other than **Normal** is specified for **Multiple Page**.

9. Border Line

Specify the border line between pages when a setting other than **Normal** is specified for **Multiple Page**.

1. Density Adjustment

Select the printing density.

2. Scaling

Specify the reduction or enlargement ratio for printing.

3. Mirror Print

Select to print your document in reverse.

Specify whether the mode switching command is automatically sent when the commands are switched while using the printer.

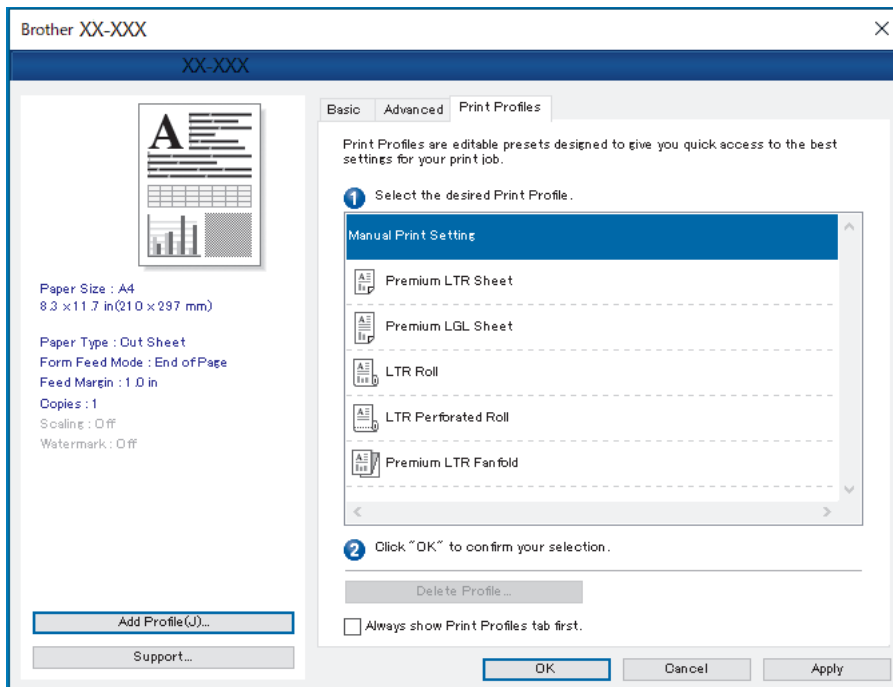

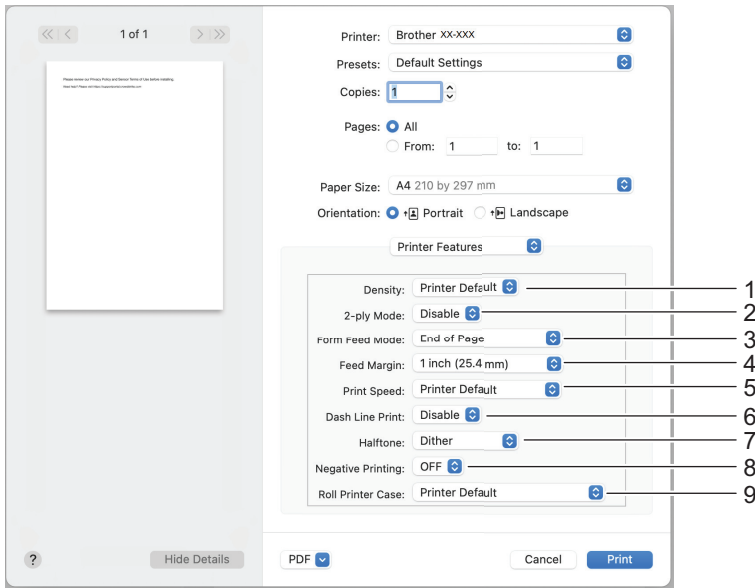

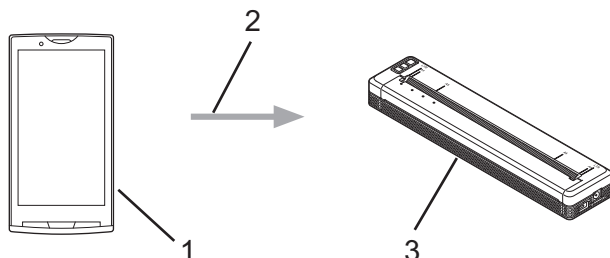

Notes on Using P-touch Transfer Manager (Windows)

Some P-touch Editor functions are not available with the printer, so keep the following points in mind when using P-touch Editor to create templates.

You can preview created templates before they are transferred to the printer.

Creating Templates

- Some of the text in the templates transferred to the printer may be printed using similar fonts and character sizes loaded in the printer. As a result, the printout may differ from the image of the template created in P-touch Editor.
- Depending on the text object setting, the character size may be automatically reduced or some of the text may not be printed. If this occurs, change the Text Object setting.
- Although character styles can be applied to individual characters in P-touch Editor, styles can be applied to a block of text only from the printer. In addition, some character styles are not available on the printer.
- Backgrounds specified in P-touch Editor are not compatible with the printer.
- The P-touch Editor layout using the split printing function (enlarging the document and printing it on two or more papers) cannot be transferred.
- Only the portion of the document within the printable area is printed.

Transferring Templates

- The printout may differ from the image appearing in the preview area of P-touch Transfer Manager.
- If a two-dimensional barcode other than a QR code not loaded on the printer is transferred to the printer, the barcode is converted into an image. The image of the converted barcode cannot be edited.
- All transferred objects that cannot be edited by the printer are converted into images.
- Grouped objects are converted into a single bitmap.
- If objects overlap, only the bottom object is printed.

Transferring Data Other Than Templates

If the number or order of fields in a database is changed and only the database (CSV file) is transferred to update it, the database may not link correctly with the template. In addition, the first line of data in the transferred file must be recognised by the printer as "field names".

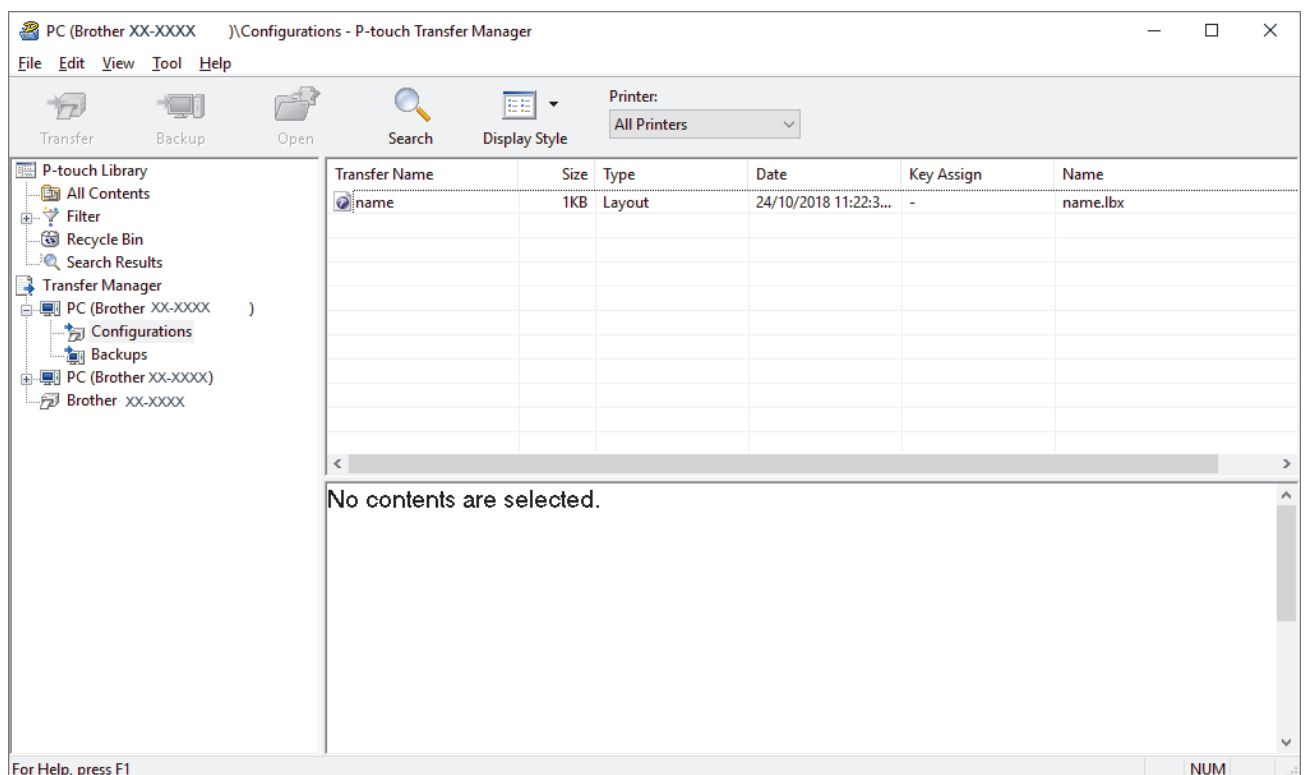

Before attempting to configure a wireless network, confirm the following:

- If you are using an enterprise wireless network, you must know the User ID and Password.
- To achieve optimum results with normal everyday document printing, place your printer as close to the wireless LAN access point/router as possible with minimal obstructions. Large objects and walls between the two devices and interference from other electronic devices can affect the data transfer speed of your documents.
Due to these factors, wireless may not be the best method of connection for all types of documents and applications.
- If there is a signal in the vicinity, wireless LAN allows you to freely make a LAN connection. However, if security settings are not correctly configured, the signal may be intercepted by malicious third parties, possibly resulting in:
 - Theft of personal or confidential information
 - Improper transmission of information to parties impersonating the specified individuals
 - Dissemination of transcribed communication contents that were intercepted



Make sure you know your wireless router/access point's Network Name (SSID) and Network Key (Password). If you cannot find this information, consult the manufacturer of your wireless router/access point, your system administrator, or Internet provider. Brother cannot provide this information.

Enable or Disable Wi-Fi

Follow these steps to enable or disable Wi-Fi or Bluetooth and Wi-Fi:

Press the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button  to enable or disable the printer's Wi-Fi function.

When the Wi-Fi function is enabled, the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi indicator  is lit or flashing in green  /  or cyan  / .

If the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi indicator  is flashing in blue , press and hold the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button  for about three seconds. The flashing colour changes each time you press and hold the Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button . Press Bluetooth and Wi-Fi button  for three seconds to toggle between connection modes.

Your printer supports the use of multiple security certificates, which allows secure management, authentication, and communication with the printer. The following security certificate features can be used with the printer:

- SSL/TLS communication
- IEEE 802.1x authentication

Your printer supports the following:

- Pre-installed certificate

Your printer has a pre-installed self-signed certificate. This certificate enables you to use SSL/TLS communication without creating or installing a different certificate.



The pre-installed self-signed certificate protects your communication up to a certain level. We recommend using a certificate that is issued by a trusted organisation for better security.

- Self-signed certificate

This print server issues its own certificate. Using this certificate, you can easily use the SSL/TLS communication without creating or installing a different certificate from a CA.

- Certificate from a Certificate Authority (CA)

There are two methods for installing a certificate from a CA. If you already have a certificate from a CA or if you want to use a certificate from an external trusted CA:

- When using a Certificate Signing Request (CSR) from this print server.
- When importing a certificate and a private key.

- Certificate Authority (CA) Certificate

To use a CA certificate that identifies the CA and owns its private key, you must import that CA certificate from the CA before configuring the security features of the Network.



- If you are going to use SSL/TLS communication, we recommend contacting your system administrator first.
- When you reset the print server back to its default factory settings, the certificate and the private key that are installed will be deleted. If you want to keep the same certificate and the private key after resetting the print server, export them before resetting, and then reinstall them.



Introduction to SSL/TLS

Secure Socket Layer (SSL) or Transport Layer Security (TLS) is an effective method of protecting data sent over a local or wide area network (LAN or WAN). It works by encrypting data, such as a print job, sent over a network, so anyone trying to capture it will not be able to read it.

SSL/TLS will work with other forms of security such as WPA keys and firewalls.

Brief History of SSL/TLS

SSL/TLS was originally created to secure web traffic information, particularly data sent between web browsers and servers. For example, when you use Internet Explorer for Internet Banking and you see https:// and the little padlock icon in the web browser, you are using SSL. SSL is now used with additional applications, such as Telnet, printer, and FTP software, in order to become a universal solution for online security. Its original design intentions are still being used today by many online retailers and banks to secure sensitive data, such as credit card numbers, customer records, etc.

SSL/TLS uses extremely high levels of encryption and is trusted by banks all over the world.

Benefits of Using SSL/TLS

The primary benefit of using SSL/TLS is to guarantee secure printing over an IP network by restricting unauthorised users from reading data sent to the printer. SSL's most important benefit is that it can be used to print confidential data securely. For example, a Human Resource (HR) Department in a large company may be printing wage slips on a regular basis. Without encryption, the data contained on these wages slips can be read by other network users. However, with SSL/TLS, anyone trying to capture the data will see a page of code and not the actual wage slip.

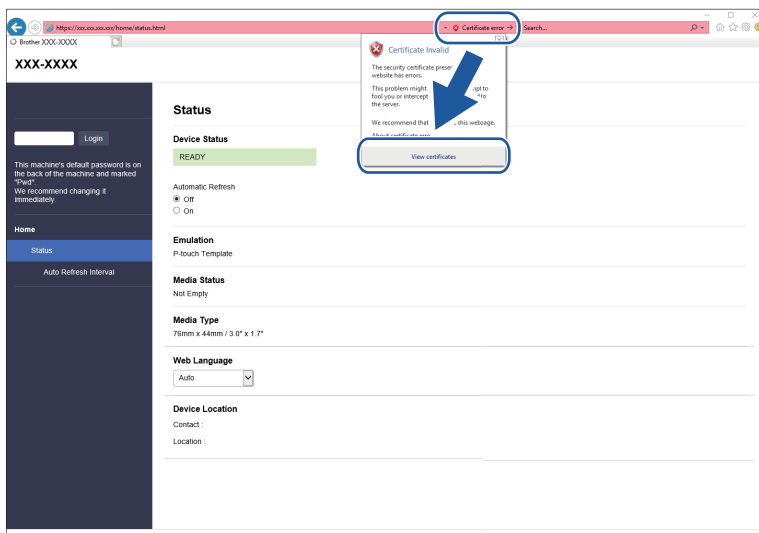

The Simple Network Management Protocol version 3 (SNMPv3) provides user authentication and data encryption to manage network devices securely.


1. Start your web browser.
2. Type "https://Common Name" in your browser's address bar (where "Common Name" is the Common Name that you assigned to the certificate; this could be your IP address, node name, or domain name).
3. If required, type the password in the **Login** field, and then click **Login**.





The default password to manage this printer's settings is located in the battery cavity and marked "**Pwd**".

4. Go to the navigation menu, and then click **Network > Network > Protocol**.



Start from  if the navigation menu is not shown on the left side of the screen.

5. Make sure the **SNMP** setting is enabled, and then click **Advanced Settings**.
6. Configure the SNMP settings.

Option	Description
SNMP v1/v2c read-write access	The print server uses version 1 and version 2c of the SNMP protocol. You can use all of your printer's applications in this mode. However, it is not secure since it will not authenticate the user and data will not be encrypted.
SNMPv3 read-write access and v1/v2c read-only access	The print server uses the read-write access of version 3 and the read-only access of version 1 and version 2c of the SNMP protocol.  When you use the SNMPv3 read-write access and v1/v2c read-only access mode, some of your printer's applications that access the print server do not work correctly since they authorise the read-only access of version 1 and version 2c. If you want to use all applications, we recommend using the SNMP v1/v2c read-write access mode.
SNMPv3 read-write access	The print server uses version 3 of the SNMP protocol. If you want to manage the print server securely, use this mode.  When you use the SNMPv3 read-write access mode, note the following: Except for BRAdmin Professional, all applications that use SNMPv1/v2c will be restricted. To allow the use of SNMPv1/v2c applications, use the SNMPv3 read-write access and v1/v2c read-only access or SNMP v1/v2c read-write access mode.

7. Click **Submit**.



If your printer displays the protocol setting options, select the options you want.

8. Restart your printer to activate the configuration.

What Is IEEE 802.1x Authentication?

IEEE 802.1x is an IEEE standard for wireless networks that limits access from unauthorised network devices. Your Brother printer (supplicant) sends an authentication request to a RADIUS server (Authentication server) through your access point. After your request has been verified by the RADIUS server, your printer can access the network.

- If you configure your printer using EAP-TLS authentication, you must install the client certificate issued by a CA before you start configuration. Contact your network administrator about the client certificate. If you have installed more than one certificate, we recommend writing down the certificate name you want to use.
- Before you verify the server certificate, you must import the CA certificate issued by the CA that signed the server certificate. Contact your network administrator or your Internet Service Provider (ISP) to confirm whether a CA certificate import is necessary.



Verify the server certificate using the CA certificate, imported to the printer in advance, issued by the CA that signed the server certificate.

Select one of the following verification methods from the **Server Certificate Verification** drop-down list:

Option	Description
No Verification	The server certificate can always be trusted. The verification is not performed.
CA Cert.	The verification method to check the CA reliability of the server certificate, using the CA certificate issued by the CA that signed the server certificate.

Option	Description
CA Cert. + ServerID	The verification method to check the common name ¹ value of the server certificate, in addition to the CA reliability of the server certificate.

¹ The common name verification compares the common name of the server certificate to the character string configured for the **Server ID**. Before you use this method, contact your system administrator about the server certificate's common name and then configure **Server ID**.

7. When finished with configuration, click **Submit**.

EAP-FAST

Extensible Authentication Protocol-Flexible Authentication via Secured Tunneling (EAP-FAST) has been developed by Cisco Systems, Inc., which uses a user ID and password for authentication, and symmetric key algorithms to achieve a tunnelled authentication process.

PEAP

Protected Extensible Authentication Protocol (PEAP) is a version of EAP method developed by Cisco Systems, Inc., Microsoft Corporation and RSA Security. PEAP creates an encrypted Secure Sockets Layer (SSL)/Transport Layer Security (TLS) tunnel between a client and an authentication server, for sending a user ID and password. PEAP provides mutual authentication between the server and the client.

- PEAP/GTC

EAP-TTLS

Extensible Authentication Protocol-Tunneled Transport Layer Security (EAP-TTLS) has been developed by Funk Software and Certicom. EAP-TTLS creates a similar encrypted SSL tunnel to PEAP, between a client and an authentication server, for sending a user ID and password. EAP-TTLS provides mutual authentication between the server and the client.

- EAP-TTLS/PAP

EAP-TLS

Extensible Authentication Protocol-Transport Layer Security (EAP-TLS) requires digital certificate authentication both at a client and an authentication server.

Settings Dialog Box



1. Menu Bar

Provides access to various commands grouped under each menu title (the **File**, **Tools**, and **Help** menus) according to their functions.

2. Device Name

Displays the device name.

3. Settings Display/Change Area

Displays the current settings for the selected item.

4. Refresh

Click to update the displayed settings with the most recent information.

5. Exit

Click to exit the **Communication Settings** window and return to the main window of the Printer Setting Tool.



Settings are not applied to printers if **Exit** is clicked without clicking the **Apply** button after changing the settings.

6. Apply

Click to apply the settings to the printer. To save the specified settings in a command file, select the **Save in Command File** command from the drop-down list. The saved command file can be used with the mass storage mode to apply the settings to a printer.





Clicking **Apply** applies all settings in all tabs to the printer. If the **Disable these settings** checkbox is selected, the settings are not applied.


7. Items

When the **Current Status** menu is selected, the current settings appear in the settings display/change area. Select the item for the settings you want to change.

8. Disable these settings

When this checkbox is selected,  appears in the tab, and the settings can no longer be specified or changed. Settings in a tab where  appears are not applied to the printer even if **Apply** is clicked. In addition, the settings in the tab are not saved or exported when the **Save in Command File** or **Export** command is used. To apply the settings to the printer, or to save or export them, make sure you clear the checkbox.

9. Settings Tabs

Contains settings that may be specified or changed. If  appears in the tab, the settings are not applied to the printer.

10. Printer

Lists the connected printers.

Save the specified settings in a command file. The file extension is BIN. The saved command file can be used with the mass storage mode to apply the settings to a printer.

- If the **Disable these settings** checkbox is selected, the settings are not saved.
 - The following information is not saved with the command file:
 - Node name
 - IP address, subnet mask, and default gateway (when the IP address is set to **STATIC**)
 - The saved communication settings commands are intended to be used only for applying settings to a printer. To apply the settings to the printer using this command file, use the mass storage mode.
 - Saved command files contain authentication keys and passwords. Take necessary measures to protect saved command files, such as saving them in a location that cannot be accessed by other users.
 - Do not send command files to a different printer model.

Install Certificates (PJ-883)

Some network authentication methods may require a certificate.

Install a certificate on the connected printer or save a certificate as a command file that can be distributed to the same printer models.

Import

Import from the current computer wireless settings (PJ-883)

Imports the settings from the computer.



-
- When importing the computer's wireless settings, administrator privileges for the computer are needed.
 - Only personal security authentication settings (open system, public key authentication, WPA/WPA2-PSK, and WPA3 SAE up to 63 characters) can be imported. Enterprise security authentication (such as EAP-FAST), WPA2-PSK (TKIP) and WPA-PSK (AES) settings cannot be imported.
 - If multiple wireless LANs are enabled for the computer you use, the first detected wireless settings (only personal settings) are considered for the import data.
 - Only the settings from the **Wireless LAN** tab - **Wireless Settings** pane can be imported (communication mode, SSID, authentication method, encryption mode and authentication key).

Select a Profile to import

Imports the exported file and applies the settings to a printer. Click **Browse** and select the file you want to import. The settings in the selected file appear in the settings display/change area.



-
- All settings can be imported, except for node names.
 - Only the profiles compatible with the selected printer can be imported.
 - If the imported profile's IP address is set to **STATIC**, change the IP address of the imported profile, if needed, so that it does not duplicate the IP address of an existing configured printer on the network.

Export

Save the current settings in a file. If the **Disable these settings** checkbox is selected, the settings are not saved.



Exported files are not encrypted.

Tools Menu Options

Option Settings

Automatically restart the printer after applying new settings

If this checkbox is selected, the printer automatically restarts after communication settings are applied. If this checkbox is cleared, you must restart the printer manually.



When configuring multiple printers, you can reduce the time needed to change settings by clearing this checkbox. In this case, we recommend selecting this checkbox when configuring the first printer so that you can confirm that each setting is operating as intended.

Automatically detects the connected printer, and retrieves the current settings

If this checkbox is selected and a printer is connected to the computer, the printer is automatically detected and the printer's current settings are displayed in the **Current Status** pane.



If the connected printer is different from the printer shown in the **Printer** drop-down list, the settings available on all tabs change to match the connected printer.

Change Node Name/Bluetooth Device Name

Allows renaming a node name and Bluetooth device name.

To specify higher level security settings: When performing certificate verification with EAP-FAST, PEAP, EAP-TTLS, or EAP-TLS authentication methods, the certificate cannot be specified from the Printer Setting Tool. After the printer is configured to connect to the network, specify the certificate by accessing the printer from a web browser. 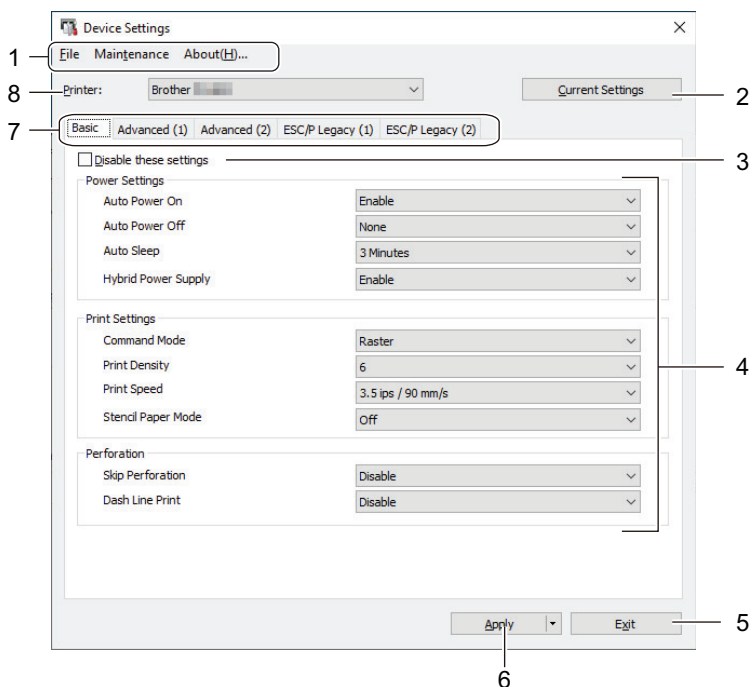

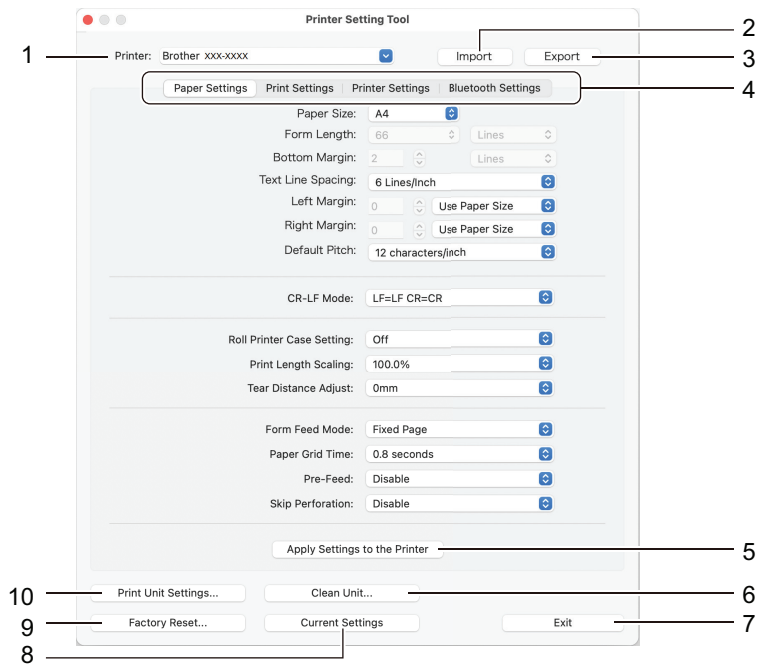

When using Web Based Management, the following operations are available:

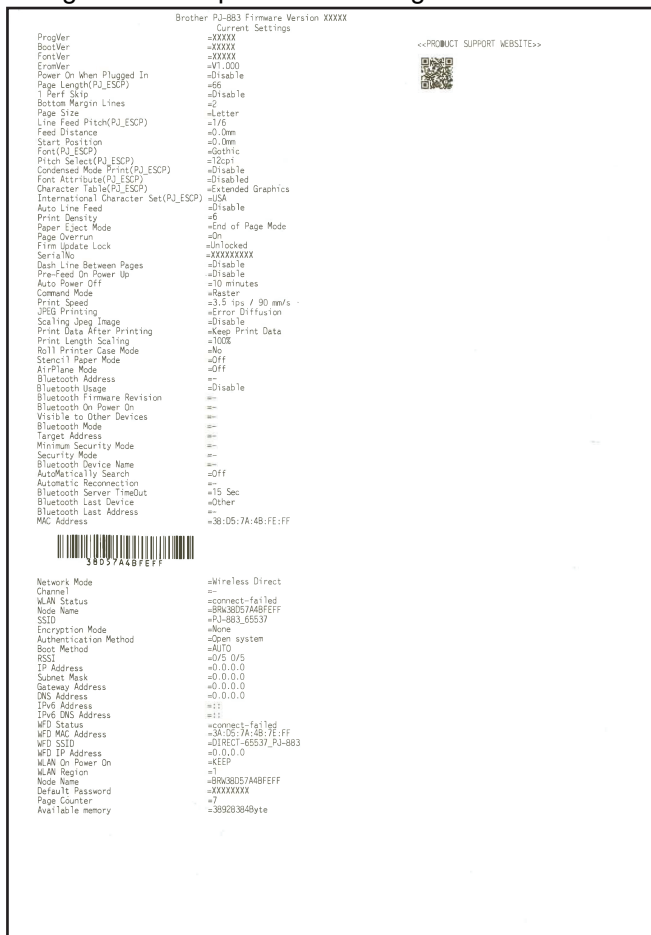
To confirm the printer settings, you can print a Letter-size configuration report without connecting the printer to a computer or mobile device. (The report will fit on A4-size paper.)

1. Turn the printer on.
2. Make sure no paper is loaded.
3. Press and hold the Feed button  until the Data indicator lights in red .
4. Insert a piece of genuine Brother thermal paper into the printer's paper input slot.

The report starts printing.



The report indicates the model name, serial number, and more detailed information on the printer's configuration and parameter settings.

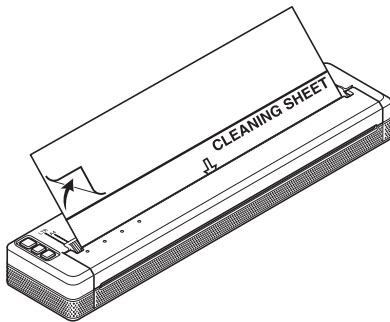

Clean the Platen Roller

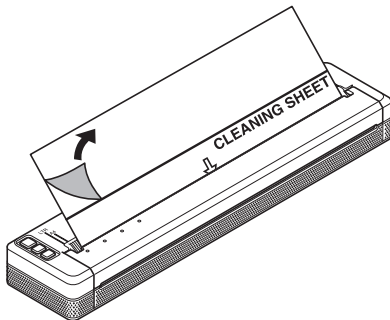
Dirt and debris on the Platen Roller can cause the paper to be fed incorrectly (skewing the print image) and degrade the print quality (distorting the print image).

1. Turn the printer on and make sure no paper is loaded.
2. Insert the cleaning sheet into the Paper Input Slot.

The text "CLEANING SHEET" should be upright and face the front of the printer, as shown. The roller will pull the cleaning sheet into the starting position.



3. Remove the backing paper on the top half of the cleaning sheet, as shown.



Do not remove the backing paper from the bottom half of the cleaning sheet.

4. Press the Feed button  for more than two seconds.

The printer will feed and eject the cleaning sheet.

- Do not attempt to clean the Platen Roller with any material other than the cleaning sheet.
 - The cleaning sheet is for cleaning the Platen Roller only. Do not use it to clean any other part of the printer.
 - Contact Brother or your Brother dealer for a replacement cleaning sheet.

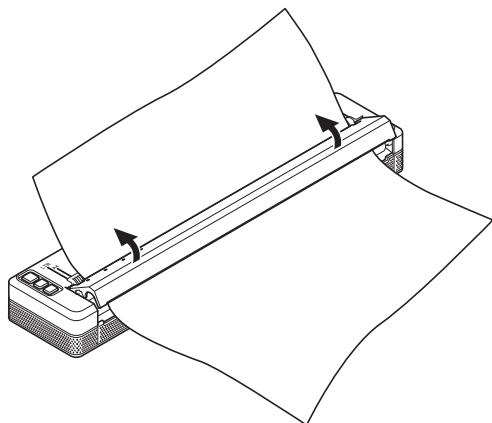
Wipe the printer's surface with a dry cloth.

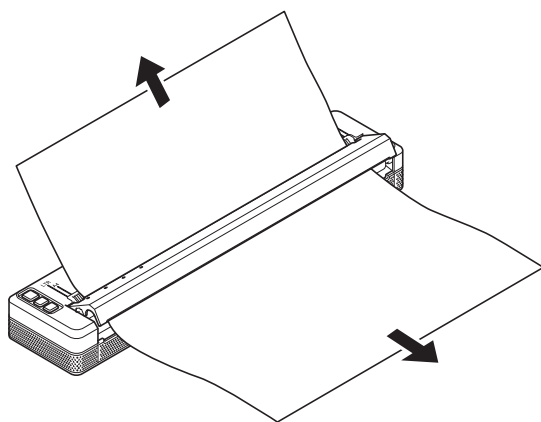
- Do not use a wet cloth or allow water to enter the printer.

Clear a Paper Jam

1. Carefully lift the Release Cover up to open it.



2. Carefully pull the paper out of the printer in either direction.



3. Close the Release Cover.
4. Insert paper and print again.



2. Press and hold the Feed button  and the Power button  for about two seconds.
3. While holding down the Feed button , press the Power button  two times, and then release the Feed button .

The Power Indicator starts flashing in orange .

4. Do one of the following:
 - Press Feed button  three times to reset the printer's device settings to their factory settings and delete all the data transferred to the printer.
 - Press Feed button  four times to reset the printer's communication and device settings to their factory settings and delete all the data transferred to the printer.
